

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Family,

Many of you have received regular updates regarding the Splendor of Carmel through our Flocknote email each week. If you do not receive my weekly update each week regarding the life of the parish, I'd encourage you to sign up for it. Links to sign up are on the first page of our website (olmc.org) underneath the Mass schedule. For those who don't subscribe to Flocknote – or let it go to the junk email or forget to take a look – I wanted to give an update regarding the parish renovation.

Our original date of hopeful dedication was to be the end of the summer. We're not going to make that deadline, due to a lot of complications with receiving materials in a timely fashion. But we are now making some solid progress. To date, we have had the complete demolition of the old concrete stadium layout, a level slab installed, the sanctuary steps and platform poured, and the niches and arches installed. The plaster work on the side shrines, columns, and sanctuary is complete, and painting has been happening non-stop. The exterior doors have been roughed in and will now be stained and sealed, and interior doors have arrived for fitting as well. Lighting has been placed but will still be adjusted. And currently, the entire church is filled with scaffolding so the artistic painters can offer their talent on the ceiling and archways. We made the decision to make the central narthex area match the interior, so some work has begun in that area as well (so that the support beams in the narthex match the columns inside the church). So while there were some slow times, we are now on a great pace. In general, we have been on track with expenses, with no major setbacks. That's all great news.

The next steps will be to finish with the ceiling – that should be about three weeks of meticulous painting and craftsmanship. The doors will be installed, then flooring, furniture, and pews. All of those are on a specific timeline, and we know towards the end we may face some interruptions. We do not have a dedication date at this time, but we will likely be asking the bishop to schedule a visit for the dedication sometime in early October – assuming his schedule agrees with all of this! Pray for the very dedicated work crews who have been here and for expedience in shipments and materials arriving.

This week I met with the finance council and consultants of the parish to talk through the current financial position – we are in good shape and due to the generosity of our parishioners, we have been paying all expenses with cash-on-hand. As many of the larger bills come in (pews, flooring, and final construction costs) we will likely use a bridge loan to pay the costs as pledges come in. I am so grateful to those who have already fulfilled their pledges, or those who are doing it gradually over time.

While we are in a good financial position, I would take this as an opportunity to invite any parishioners who have not made a sacrificial gift or pledge to consider doing so. This will assist with unpaid pledges or additional expenses, as well as allow us to pay the bridge loan debt more quickly. Information to make your pledge or gift is available online or in the lobby of Saint Michael Hall.

Finally, a heart of deep gratitude for your amazing generosity and flexibility as we have worshipped in Saint Michael Hall. It has been a long time of walking past a church to get to SMH and a constant flux, but I am so grateful with how you have weathered the storm with such joy. I promise, it will be worth it!

Bautismo Infantil


